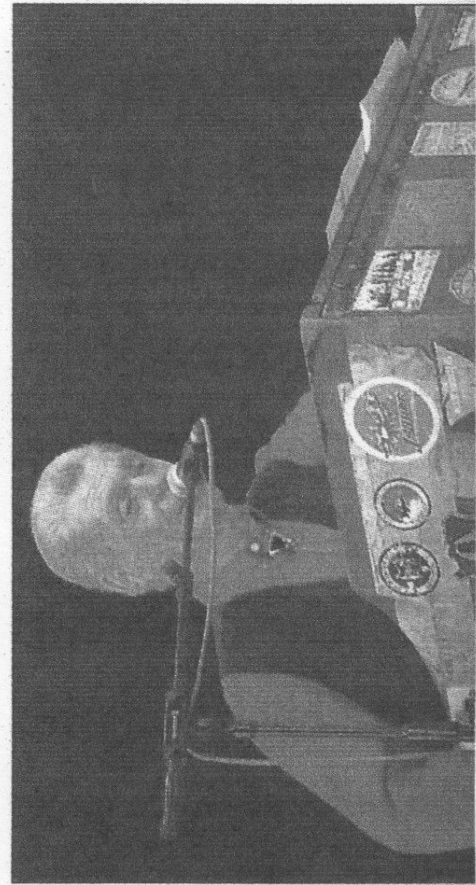
Fame is fleeting, so they say. But Georgie Fame, now in his fifth decade in the music biz, endures quite nicely, equally respected in the fields of rock 'n' roll, jazz and R&B.

Do you recognize the name? Fame is one of the seminal figures in British pop music, a proud survivor of the swingin' '60s, now aged 60 himself. And he's headed our way this week-

The new name was prophetic. Soon, there was an historic, fateful tour of the U.K. with Eddie Cochran and Gene Vincent. Cochran perished in a car crash. Fame was in Vincent's backing band, and wound up making his recording debut with Vincent in 1960, playing piano on "Pistol Packin' Mama."

Then came a pivotal period when Georgie Fame & His Blue Flames were the hottest bar act in London.
